Please also let us know the reason for your decision; this is a necessity for the reviewing process.

Reason:

The interest in the main topic of the CWA/DIN-SPEC (“Emerging Risks, New Technologies”) has increased considerably, both in Europe and world-wide. Several new projects, especially in the areas of security and resistance and in nanotechnologies have exploited the work done on the CWA/DIN-SPEC and used its principles for their work.

The main projects concerned are, for example, caLIBRAte, NanoReg2, SmartResilience and ResiStand. The first two would be the main source of updates for the current informative annex B while the other two projects would be the main source for one or more new informative annexes.

The annexes will cover:

- Risk & Resilience Framework
- Systematic Risk
- Risk & Resilience Indicators

In terms of the procedure, we propose to:

1. Accept the extension of the validity of the document “with minor modifications” (May-June 2017)
2. Work on annexes and then decide if new workshops and/or BT consultations are needed (end of 2017)
3. Explore the possibilities of bringing in the topic onto the agenda (a new “work item”?) of e.g. TC262 or TC292 (end of 2017)
